From the Pastor's Desk....

"I am grateful to God—when I remember you and recall your tears. I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that live your grandmother and your mother. 1 Timothy 1:5

On May 9th we celebrate our mothers—who they are, have been, and who continues to be in our lives. As I grow older, I have a constant reminder of my mother—each morning when I look in the mirror—there she is. As a young girl I remember saying to myself that I would never want to be like her. Surprise! I have become here in so many ways and my grandmother as well. Why is it we never appreciate them when we are young? The sacrifices, the kindnesses, the lessons and oh, the love. Once in a while I find myself wishing she were here to share something with her or to just talk and to tell her how much I wish I could have made her life easier. Then she would have said, "Nothing in life is easy." I ran across a wonderful story written by Erma Bombeck as a tribute to her mother. Perhaps you have heard it before, but so worth sharing.

Unfinished Business:


PNC Committee Report update: _Nothing more to report at this time. Keep the committee in your prayers.
