Prior to his early retirement he was employed by Unisys Corporation where he designed computer software systems for the banking industry. His main hobby was travel. He traveled exten-


sively including visits to most of the U.S. as well as trips to Canada (many times on fishing trips with his grandparents), England and Germany, several times, the Netherlands and France, several times.


